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The fellowship aims to enhance capacity of mid-career public health professionals in health policy and systems research methods to strengthen evidence-based policymaking in health. Completion of Module on Introduction to HPSR and framing HPSR questions

This month fellows were introduced to the origins and evolution of HPSR as a field. They engaged in vibrant discussions with faculty members on the fuzziness of HPSR's boundaries, and about how HPSR as an emerging field relates to health services research, health systems research, implementation research, and operational research. They were walked through the process of formulating HPSR research questions and identifying appropriate research designs to answer these questions. Emphasis was on using systems thinking, complexity, equity, and ethics lenses during the research process. In the face-to-face sessions that will follow, the fellows will be guided to reflect upon the ontological and epistemological underpinnings of their research.

Lectures and interactions included but were not limited to, recognizing the centrality of stakeholder inputs to formulating HPSR research questions, realizing that what questions get asked and answered is an intervention in itself, appreciating how HPSR draws on different disciplinary resources to answer research questions, and recognizing that the drafting and crafting of research questions is an active iterative process.

Discussions focussed on research designs to elicit learnings for policymaking, drawing examples from contemporary issues such as the Indian health system's response to COVID-19, ability of government initiatives like Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana to effectively reach the poor, barriers to nursing practices in India, how social context shapes access to health and nutrition programs for tribal communities, policies related to elderly care & mental health.
